Pastoral Ponderings

From Pastor Phil

This year, the month of March holds some significant dates. We continue through the season of Lent, and come at the end of March to Holy Week. This point in the year is rough as we really come face to face with the consequence of sin. The Law of God is just and wise, and in it, the penalty for sin is death. All sin is a rebellion against God, therefore all sin is treated the same way.

When we think about sin, it becomes worthwhile to consider our catechism from so many years ago. Sin comes to us in two ways. Original sin is the one that gets us and causes the most problem. Original sin is that inward rebellion that you just inherit. Since you are a human, born on planet earth, you are sinful. It is something that you inherited all the back to Noah, and then to Adam. There's no escaping it. It is the worst virus to plague mankind. There's nothing we can do about it. We simply have it.

The other form of sin is what the historic church has called "actual" sin. I really don't care for this name as it downplays the reality of original sin. Instead, I prefer to call this "active" sin. This is the stuff that original sin causes you to do. Don't want to go to church? That's ok. You don't have to. Original sin sets your will against the will of God and you act out on it. Active sin is the stuff that we do that does not bring glory to God Himself. This is the outflow of our sinfulness.

Your Mite Offerings Make an Impact!

Read below to find out how your mite offerings work within our **church**, our **community** and our **world**. The following are examples of good stewardship.

Mission Moment - In the National LWML

Equipping Young Leaders - LCMS Youth Ministry - \$50,000

Survey results show that the best way to keep young people connected to the church is to give them chances to serve and lead. This grant will allow LCMS Youth Ministry to expand their current programs to equip young leaders. **Mission Moment Note**: Our Zion youth have benefited from this expansion of Youth Lead seminars and programs. We have seen a positive impact on our kids as they have started to take the helm in leading other youth, having Bible studies, organizing and leading a youth retreat at Rustic Acres in the summer of 2023. The future looks bright!

Water and the Word - Evangelical Lutheran Church in Kenya - \$80,000

Students and orphanages lack clean water and regular access to pastoral care. Water and the Word installs water harvesting equipment, filters, hand wash stations, and clean water storage systems. After installation, a pastor visits with the schools, makes sure that the clean water systems are working properly and provides pastoral care to individuals. This grant will provide clean water and cover travel expenses for pastoral care to students in 12 additional schools and orphanages in Kenya.

Mobile Kitchen - Forged by Fire Services, Gulf Coast Region, U.S. - \$85,000

Forged by Fire Services strives to actively make known the love of Jesus Christ through its actions and words by providing warm meals, bottled water, and spiritual care to people in times of need following a disaster or economic downturn. This grant will allow the purchase of a mobile, self-contained kitchen trailer unit.. The kitchen will benefit smaller communities in need that are often overlooked by larger organizations.
